Those in attendance included the former IEEE USA President Gary Blank. It was amazing to note that over 300 attendees were there to help us celebrate Engineers Week.

Each Engineering Society Chair was called to the stage to present the plaques and awards for their Societies and the first IEEE award was to Anthony "TJ" Ross as Student Engineer of the Year. Other societies also had Students of the Year awards to distribute, and some of the societies also had awards for "Young Professionals of the Year."

The Outstanding Teachers included: Missy Allison (Durant High School Biology Teacher), Jim Reve (Lennard High School Robotics Coach) and Cheryl Reve (Lennard High School Environmental Teacher) who each received the well-deserved Lignell Awards for their work with students.

Jessica McRory, chair of this year's TBEW banquet committee introduced the Keynote Speaker: Dr. Story Musgrave. Some of the main points in his biography included: Growing up on a farm and operating heavy farm equipment as a child and joining the Marines and flying bomber planes in the Korean War, after which he attended Syracuse University and became a neuro-surgeon. Then, in the late 1970s, he became an astronaut and helped launch the Hubble Telescope.

After Dr. Musgrave's outstanding talk, the "Engineer of the Year Awards" was presented. The IEEE FWCS immediate past chair, Serge Beauzile, was the 2014 IEEE Engineer of the Year. Other noteworthy Engineers of the Year Awards for each Society went to: Jessica McRory (ASCE), Larry Josephson (ASHE), and Stephen Elting (ASME).

Overall it was another outstanding and successful event and the TBEW Committee should be congratulated for volunteer work to make this event happen.


